Below are just a few of the victories KLA had in the Statehouse during the 2022 legislative session.

SB 261 | Fake Meat Labeling

A KLA-proposed bill that requires the accurate labeling of fake meat products. The governor signed the bill on May 5, 2022.

SB 551 | Proposal to split Division of Animal Health

KLA opposed a bill backed by the Humane Society of the United States that would have removed the animal health commissioner's authority over the pet animal program. The bill failed to advance in the Senate.

HB 2686 | Water Agency Bill

A KLA-opposed bill that would have created a new executive branch agency, the Kansas Department of Water and Environment, removing the Division of Conservation and the Division of Water Resources from the Kansas Department of Agriculture while increasing fees on all water users. The bill failed to advance in the House.

HB 2605 | Rural Veterinary Scholarship Program

A KLA-supported bill that expanded the Veterinary Training Program for Rural Kansas. It was signed by the governor.

HB 2239 | Fencing Sales Tax Exemption

A KLA-supported bill that permanently exempts all labor and materials to construct agricultural fence. It was signed by the governor on April 14, 2022.
